Quality education to serve as a springboard to success

- 62 new Navodaya Vidyalayas to be opened
- Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan to increase focus on quality of education
- Regulatory architecture to be provided to 10 public and 10 private institutions to emerge as world-class institutions
- Higher Education Financing Agency to be set up with initial capital base of Rs. 1000 crore
- SWAYAM: Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) with courses from High School to Post graduation to make high quality learning resources easily available.
- National Scholarship Portal (NSP) has been launched as a common portal by the Government for various scholarship schemes of different Ministries.

Opening new frontiers for the youth

• Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) for skill training in accordance with National Skill Qualifications Framework (NSQF) launched. Close to 20 lakh youth across India trained under PMKVY in the past one year. Youth who do not possess formal certification, also being assessed and certified through an initiative known as Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) in PMKVY.


- Deen Dayal Upadhyay Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY): Government's support for skilling courses for rural youth. 724 ongoing training programmes in 1100 training centres across 21 cities. 3.56 lakh youth trained and over 1.88 lakh placed in jobs.
- Skill Loan Scheme: Loans from Rs. 5,000 to Rs.1.5 lakh to be made available to 34 lakh youth.
- Setting up of training centres at 53 locations across the country under Skill India.

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


- 1141 new ITIs with 1.73 lakh seats have been started in the past year.
- 34 ITIs and 68 Skill Development Centres are also being established in 34 Left Wing Extremism (LWE) affected districts to open up employment opportunities for youth in these areas.
- The Apprenticeship Act was modified in 2014, to incentivise employers to take on more apprentices.
- Skill Assessment Matrix for Vocational Advancement of Youth (SAMVAY) to promote seamless movement from education to skill and life-long learning through flexible credit transfers for degree/ diploma holders.
- Maulana Azad National Academy for Skills (MANAS) to address skill development needs of minority communities – focus on self-employment and entrepreneurship

Employment

Giving wings to the aspirations of youth

- To give a boost to formal Employment, the Government of India will pay contribution of 8.33% for all new employees enrolling in Employees Provident Fund Organisation (EPFO) for the first three years of their employment.
- India BPO Promotion Scheme for creation of employment opportunities for 1.44 lakh people. North East BPO Promotion Scheme to incentivise establishment of 5000 seats of BPO/ ITES operations.
- National Career Service (NCS) Project aims to address gaps in the employment market by strategic interventions. Project aims to establish 100 Model Career Centres (MCC) in collaboration with States and other institutions.
- Abolition of interviews for all Group B (Non Gazetted) and Group C posts in Central Government.

Entrepreneurship

Creating a nation of job creators

- Easy availability of credit through Mudra Yojana
- For the first time ever, Indian Government has not only recognised start-ups but has come up with Start Up India to foster innovation and entrepreneurship among the youth. The action plan launched by the Government of India focuses on:
 - Simplification and Handholding
 - Funding Support and Incentives
 - Industry-Academia Partnership and Incubation.





- There are multiple incentives and benefits for the youth involved with start-ups which include compliance based on self certification, registration through a mobile app, legal support, relaxed norms for public procurement, tax exemption on capital gains, income tax exemption in the first 3 years and creation of a vibrant start-up ecosystem throughout the country.
- More than 20,000 entrepreneurs trained under Niryat Bandhu Scheme.

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
